

CENTRALIA STATION ALLOCATED ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM STATE TRANSPORTATION BUDGET FOR INFRASTRUCTURE

On March 10, 2022, the Washington State Legislature passed the \$17-billion "Move Ahead Washington" transportation budget. This package included an additional \$1.7 million for the Port of Centralia to complete its infrastucture project for Centralia Station. The gap funding will help the Port cover the project cost increases due to delays relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The project will be carried out in two phases. The first phase will extend Yew Street and will be sent out for bids in the near future. Immediately following, the second phase will construct an off-ramp from the Mellen Street/I-5 interchange pending the completion of final federal agency review.

Conceived in 2010, Centralia Station will include retail, commercial, and light industrial businesses when completed. The development is projected to create over 500 permanent jobs, produce over \$118 million in annual sales, and generate over \$7 million annually in state and local taxes.


TEXAS COMPANY PURCHASES PORT PROPERTY FOR NEW DISTRIBUTION CENTER

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Furgerson Schmidt LLC has closed on a 7-acre site in the Port's Park I development. The company, a member of the Texas-based GVH Distribution family of companies, plans to construct a new 100,000-sq-ft distribution center on the site. GVH Distribution is a supplier of supermarket and food service packaging. The new facility will help the company serve their Pacific Northwest customers.

The Murrays started their business in their garage that they had converted into a commercial kitchen. In 2015, 4Legz moved to its first industrial building in the Port of Centralia. The new location helped them grow their company and focus on their product distribution. During the COVID pandemic, the pet industry took off as many pet owners were focusing on their pets while staying home. Despite this boost, 4Legz felt the downside of the supply shortages and multiple shutdowns. Through it all, the Murrays fought to retain several staff members, despite the lack of work, and 4Legz is back better than ever.

Now 4Legz is moving two doors down to a larger facility in the Port's Park I. Their production capabilities needed to expand and the larger space will allow them to acquire more equipment to double and quadruple their production lines as their products enter into more distribution channels.

Cynthia Murray said, "Less than one in five people with disabilities (19.2 percent) are even in the labor force, according to a first-ever study of the labor force characteristics of people with disabilities by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Because of the fear of hiring people with disability, I wanted to change this and make it an opportunity for those of us with a disability to find first-time jobs working here at 4Legz and get the training and understanding of what it takes to work and interact with other team members."

These skills include getting to work on time, clocking in, job training, problem solving, and following directions.

Through all the challenges, Cynthia Murray believes that establishing and running a small business as a dog treats manufacturer to be incredibly rewarding. "We consider ourselves very blessed to have met some great people along the way! Not only are they concerned about the health and well-being of their customers' pets, they also have the same attitude towards us."

The Port's Park II development continues to pay dividends to the community by attracting national developers to not only Port properties but neighboring properties as well. The Port is pleased to welcome Georgia Pacific and Ryerson Steel as new neighbors and employers in our community. Look for exciting news regarding Port properties in Park II later this year.

One of the reoccurring themes I heard as I pursued a role with the Port Commission was a desire for more information about Port projects and the tenants who reside in our industrial parks. This newsletter is the first step to meeting that need. The Port will also launch a new, more user-friendly website later this year.
